To our Washington neighbors:

April 2020



On Monday March 16 the Select Board voted to declare a state of emergency, following both the national and Commonwealth in response to the COVID-19 (corona virus) pandemic.

- The Town Hall will be closed to the public at least until April 6. This means no meetings or any other functions.
- All Town functions are continuing. If you need to speak to someone refer to the Town website's contact information page:
 - http://www.washington-ma.com/Town%20Government/directory.pdf
- All emergency services Police, Fire, Ambulance are on call.
- The Transfer Station will keep the same hours but will not be accepting white goods, electronics or construction waste; household garbage, paper and recyclables are okay. The swap shop will be closed until further notice.
- If you need to make a tax payment you can pay with a credit card online at http://www.washington-ma.com/taxcollector.html. Or you can mail a check (if you want a receipt include a stamped self-addressed envelope).
- For anyone concerned about their health care coverage or unemployment, the Governor has mandated that testing and treatment must be provide by health insurers; similarly, unemployment regulations have been relaxed. - Seniors are particularly vulnerable and are encouraged to stay in their homes; if you are a senior, or if you know a senior who may need assistance, please contact our Council on Aging (washingtoncoa@gmail.com; 413-623-6401) so that appropriate aid and support can be provided.
- Corona virus symptoms are similar to the flu and can include fever, cough and shortness of breath. If you have symptoms of corona virus, contact your primary care physician or the Berkshire Medical Center hotline at 855-262-5465.
- If you have been *exposed* to the corona virus and have symptoms contact our Public Health Nurse at alliancenurse@berkshireplanning.org or our Board of Health japhuebner@gmail.com.

- All Central Berkshire schools are closed at least until April 6; the District is working to address students' nutritional needs during the shutdown.
- Travel should be limited to shopping and medical appointments; grocery stores and pharmacies will remain open; restaurants and bars are closed although it may be possible to get take-out or delivery.

- Virtually all public events sports, concerts, etc. have been cancelled throughout the country.
- Hospital and nursing home visits may be curtailed; check before you go.
- Stay home; avoid crowds if you must go out; wash your hands frequently; cover your mouth if you are coughing or sneezing. Stay safe and stay healthy.

We will get through this together. Check on your neighbors, friends and family members; look out for each other and help each other.

In other news:

- The public forum for our Town Planning effort scheduled for April 18 has been cancelled and will be rescheduled once the crisis has passed; the work of the committee will continue through emails.
- The construction of our Broadband network continues. Many of our citizens will be well-served by being able to tele-commute!
- We issued a Request for Quotes for the demolition of Woody's; the bid opening is set for Monday April 13 at 7:30.
- We are running out of storage space for the Town's records; the Annual Town Warrant will include a request for funds to purchase a trailer to be placed on the Town Hall site to serve as a storage bin.

Thanks to Lisa Guthrie and Michelle Beemer for agreeing to get **TRACKS** out ahead of schedule to keep everyone informed during these difficult times.

Spring is coming a bit early this year it seems. Stay home, plan your garden and look forward to less stressful times!

Prevention Is Key They say ticks are active above 42degrees, but people have been bitten during winter. It takes only one bite from a tick to risk your life. Any size tick can carry Lyme Disease & Co-Infections. Although ticks like tall grass, dense vegetation, and dead leaves, they can be anywhere. Pets and mice bring them inside. Bring a walking stick when outside and tap vegetation ahead of you to knock off unwanted ticks. Ticks show up better on light colored clothing, tuck shirts into pants and tuck pants into socks. Use repellent, tick check yourself daily, carry a tick remover. If bitten, visit the International Lyme and Associated Diseases Society at www.ilads.org for their diagnostic and treatment guidelines.
