Special State Primary

With the resignation of Senator John F. Kerry, the State has scheduled a Special State Election to fill the vacancy. The Special State Primary for this election will be held Tuesday, April 30, 2013 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm, followed by the Election on Tuesday, June 25, 2013.

The last day to register to vote, or change party enrollment, for the Primary is Wednesday, April 10, 2013 from 2:00 - 4:00 PM and 7:00 - 8:00 PM.

- Remember, in a Primary, you must cast a ballot in the party you are registered in. If you are not enrolled in either party, you will have the opportunity to choose either a Republican or Democratic ballot.

The Becket Athenaeum located on Main Street in North Becket, provides free access to books, music, movies, magazines, video games and cameras, high speed internet access, and after school children's programming. Our funding comes from the towns of Becket and Washington, as well as from a small endowment, grants, and fundraising events. We have been running our operating budget at a deficit for several years due to unexpected building repairs, water system improvements, and upgrades to our catalogue.

We are asking for an increase in funding from both the towns of Becket and Washington this year to help us offset these operating cost increases. We are asking the Town of Washington to increase our funding from \$5000 (FY 2013) to \$7500 (FY 2014). Towns of similar population and demographic to Washington fund at the average per capita rate of \$10,642. We presented this information and more to the Selectboard and Finance Committee. We were asked to give a brief overview of our situation during this meeting to the Tracks readers. We appreciate your support.

To our fellow Washington residents: April 2013

We want to acknowledge those of you who took the time to come to the Special Town meeting. Democracy thrives on participation! During the meeting we eliminated the need to borrow for the completion of our new windows and doors at the Town Hall and voted for funding to fix the crumbling outer wall of the gymnasium. With the furniture donated by Williams College (thanks to Shaun Lennon) and a number of smaller cosmetic and functional improvements (thanks to Ed Bond) we are just about finished with the planned improvements to your Town Hall. To complete our drive for energy efficiency and control costs the Select Board plans to go forward with E2Sol's proposal to install solar panels on the roof of the Town Hall and provide all of the electrical needs of the Town Hall and Town Garage at \$0.132 per kilowatt hour for the next 25 years.

We have many home-based businesses in town. As a Board we must support them but also preserve the quality of life for everyone. During our Capital Assets Meeting with the Finance Committee, Planning Board, and Zoning Board of Appeals, a number of issues came up. The Planning Board is going to be considering several by-law changes – which have to be approved by the voters at a Town Meeting. If you have any concerns or ideas in these areas, please bring them to the Planning Board. The issues:

Do we want to register all businesses in town? Do we want to charge a permitting fee? Should the fee be different for large and small?

Retail business – except for agricultural products – is not permitted under our current by-laws; should we keep it that way?

Should we distinguish between smaller and larger businesses? How do we define them? Do we want limitations on the number of employees or vehicles?

Can a non-owner occupied property be used for business purposes?

"Grandfathered businesses" (those in place before our current by-law was enacted): what are they and how large can they become before they exceed their variance? How can these be transferred from their current owners?

Do we want building size or use limitations for either private use or business purposes? The Select Board sent a letter to Secretary of Transportation Davey requesting \$2 million for the rehabilitation of Washington Mountain Road. We also met with Secretary Davey to further our cause. Our State Rep, Smitty Pignatelli, also spoke to Secretary Davey on our behalf and we have had past support for fixing the road from our State Senator, Ben Downing. We urge all of our residents to contact our elected officials and ask them to support this funding. Your Board will do everything possible to see that we get the road fixed, but the more our officials hear from citizens, the better our chances!

Other issues:

We have not yet heard back from CSX regarding the damage claim for the flooding of Upper Valley Road that we submitted.

We plan to set an auction date for Mapleview this month.

Dalton plans to post a weight limit on Kirchner Road at its intersection with Washington Mountain Road; Hinsdale has not yet confirmed that it will post limits at Route 8 and Pittsfield Road.
