The ceremony dedicating Washington Mountain Road as a Scenic Byway in honor of Iraq and Afghanistan veterans was held at the Old Town Hall on July 19. Among the nearly one hundred attendees were our State Senator Ben Downing and our State Representative Smitty Pignatelli, both of whom were instrumental in getting the work done. Representative Paul Mark, Sheriff Bowler, members of the Dalton and Becket Select Boards, a member of Congressman Neal's staff, and, most importantly, dozens of veterans observed the dedication. The Town website has more details and pictures.

• Some of our residents expressed concern about this designation, primarily that the Board should have sought more public commentary. While we are confident that the overwhelming majority of Washingtonians support honoring our veterans, we are mindful that many misconceptions could have been avoided. We hope that in the future we have increased participation at Select Board meetings.

In response to concerns from some residents about the condition of some of our roads we have commissioned Berkshire Regional Planning (BRPC) to assess the Town's roads. The results will be used to both prioritize current work and as the basis for a comprehensive maintenance plan. We will share the study results when available.

Our Administrative Assistants have completed calling those who did not respond to our business census and have compiled the information. The data will be the basis for creating a business by-law or laws to protect our existing businesses and manage future development. We will begin the process Monday 8/19 with the Planning Board.

• One issue that arose during the survey is that many people no longer have a land line. We ask that those of you with no land line give your cell number to our Administrative Assistants. The information will be held in confidence and is only for use for emergency contact.

The heavy rains in June severely damaged Frost Road below the Eden Glen Dam. We have appealed to Senators Warren and Markey and Congressman Neal for expedited FEMA (Federal Emergency Management) funding. Representatives from both FEMA and MEMA (Massachusetts Emergency Management) visited the site on July 17. We hope to hear what funds will be available for reconstructing the area in the near future.

We are finalizing a Request for Proposals for hydrological studies and designs for new culverts on Cross Place, Lower Valley and Lower Sargent Roads. As we noted last month DOT will not provide any funding for these projects, so once we have cost estimates we will work with the Finance Committee on a schedule and a financing proposal for voter approval.


We are working with our neighbor towns through BRPC on the proposed gas pipeline. Dalton has already taken a stance against the pipeline. We may need to provide funding for an outside counsel. We have requested that Kinder Morgan, the company proposing the pipeline attend a Select Board meeting for a presentation and Q&A. We will post the meeting at the Transfer Station and Town Hall when it is scheduled.

Chapter 61, 61A and 61B

Are you a landowner interested in conserving our forestland or farmland and saving property taxes? An excellent publication concerning the state of Massachusetts Chapter 61 current use tax programs is available at http://masswoods.net/sites/masswoods.net/files/Ch-61-Web.pdf. Alternately Dick Spencer (623–5865) can arrange to get you a paper or emailed copy. Briefly, the Chapter 61 programs allow landowners of at least 10 acres in excess of the minimum house lot to save significantly on their property taxes in exchange for committing to not develop the land for at least 5 years. The landowner benefits from reduced property taxes; the townspeople benefit from the preservation of open land; and town finances benefit from a reduced burden for education and road maintenance.
