Massachusetts State Primary

#### State Primary Date, Polling Location and Hours

The 2018 State Primary is Tuesday, September 4, 2018. Voting will be at the Washington Town Hall, 8 Summit Hill Rd, Washington. The polls will be open from 7:00 AM until 8:00 PM.

### **Registering to Vote**

If you are a Washington town resident 18 years or older, but have never registered to vote here, please see the Town Clerk on Monday evenings from 7:00 - 9:00 PM so you can register to vote. The deadline to register and be eligible to vote in the State Primary is Wednesday, August 15, 2018. The Town Clerk does not normally have Wednesday office hours, but on this date the office will be open from 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM and 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM.

You can also mail a completed voter registration form <u>http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elepdf/Voter-reg-mail-in.pdf</u> to the town hall. It must be postmarked by the August 15th deadline.

## **Absentee Voting**

Registered voters can apply to vote by absentee ballot for one of three reasons.

- Voter will be absent from town on election day
- Voter has a physical disability
- Religious belief

In order to apply for an absentee ballot you must request one in writing. You can do this by email or postal mail. If done by postal mail (a signed letter or absentee ballot application) please allow for extra processing time.

#### **State Primary Ballot Information**

In primary elections there are separate ballots for each party (Democratic, Republican and Libertarian). You must vote the ballot for the party in which you are registered. If you are an independent voter (not registered in a particular party) you will be able to vote whichever ballot you would like.

## To our Washington neighbors:

### August 2018

Becket's interim town administrator held a disciplinary hearing concerning Fire Chief Mark Hanford. Over a hundred residents of Becket and Washington - including all of your Select Board and members of our Finance Committee - attended to express their support for the Chief and to object to what appeared to be retaliation for the Chief's 6/11/18 letter to the Berkshire Eagle. The Chief readily answered the concerns of the town administrator. It appears that the disciplinary action has been dropped, but it is not yet clear that Chief Hanford will be reappointed after next June.

Based on the recommendations of the ad hoc committee formed by Sean Connors we have appointed Nicole Miller as our Police Chief. Thanks to the committee and Nicole's good work filling in for Victor this was an easy decision.

The July 14 Hilltown Brouhaha held at our Town Park drew many hundreds of attendees to the booths, the food, games and music. We look forward to this becoming a regular summer event!

We are still hopeful that the owner of Woody's will remove the structure but he has not responded to our orders. Town Counsel is filing an Order of Attachment in Superior Court to place a lien on the property in the event of non-compliance to recover any costs.

Our two major bridge projects are inching along.

- We finally have a design for the Middlefield Road bridge over Coles Brook in for DOT's review. Once we have the go-ahead we will be bidding the work and are still hopeful of completion before winter.
- The basic design for the deep culvert on upper Frost Road has been completed but we still need both regulatory clarity about its size and a funding source.

The budget presented to Governor Baker includes full restoration of our PILOT funds. Whether or not he signs it we will be petitioning him for substantive changes to this program.

A new capital grant program for small communities was just announced. We plan to apply for funding to construct a new Town Hall roof, and then be able to use our expected Green Communities grant for solar panels and other energy improvements.

Although we have secured grant funding, we are still waiting for Berkshire Regional Planning to identify the resources we need to proceed with three separate programs:

- Shared Services. Especially in light of our difficulties with Becket over fire protection we want more formal arrangements to share public safety, public health, financial expertise, etc. among our neighboring towns and across the Berkshires.
- Capital Planning. This will allow us to better control our tax rate and expenditures.
- Town Planning. This will give us a better handle on the Town's future.

We should have a fully-fleshed out design for our broadband network very soon. This will allow costs and timing to be projected with some accuracy.

Enjoy the summer and remember that we always need volunteers! Let Jodi know if you would like to serve the Town in any capacity!
