Dog License Late Fee Reminder

Remember to register your dog **before August 31, 2021** to avoid the \$25 late fee. You can register your dog at the Town Clerk's office on Monday evenings from 7:00 - 9:00 PM or mail the necessary paperwork to the Town Hall, Attention: Town Clerk, 8 Summit Hill Road, Washington, MA 01223.

Necessary paperwork:

- Current rabies paperwork showing rabies expiration
- Proof of spay/neuter
- License fee: \$4 for spayed/neutered dog or \$10 for an unaltered dog (\$24 or \$35 after August 31, 2021)
 - If paying by check, make it payable to Town of Washington

Two storms took a real toll on our Town this past month. The 6/30 microburst caused tremendous tree damage and power outages. The 7/18 flash flood damaged several roads throughout Town, especially those crossing Depot Brook. Repair and restoration work may take several more weeks still.

Route 8 was flooded twice. The second time, significant debris was strewn across the Town Park, and a major portion of the Eden Glen Dam bank was completely washed away. We have begun discussions with MEMA about mitigation strategies to address future storm vulnerability.

Yet another meeting is planned with FEMA to try to finally secure funding to replace the collapsed Frost Rd culvert. Meanwhile, the Select Board will be contacting our U.S. Representative Richard Neal to complain about the excessive federal delays and red tape.

The Highway Dept. is seeking a new truck driver/equipment operator to fill a vacancy left by Andrew's departure. If you or anyone you know is interested in joining our crew, or to find out more information, contact Tom at 623-8383 or washingtondpw@gmail.com.

At the July STM, voters approved funding to proceed with demolition of Woody's if necessary, giving the Select Board the final tool needed. However, the situation remains complicated, as a transfer of ownership is pending. It will be in the Town's best financial interest if a new owner takes responsibility to demolish the building quickly. If not, however, or if the sale falls through, the Board will act to remove the structure and sue the owner to recoup the costs. One way or another, we are intent on resolving this long-standing frustration before winter descends.

Thanks to everyone who showed up for last month's bloodmobile at Town Hall. Washington turnout was reported to be above average, which is something to be proud of.

Don't forget to attend the <u>free Sunday concerts</u> all this month at the Town Park. These will be a fundraiser to help fix the gazebo roof. Some great acts have been booked, so don't miss them!
