To our fellow Washington residents:

The Select Board welcomed Dr. William Cameron, Superintendent of Schools for the Central Berkshire Regional School District for a discussion of our schools. Becket-Washington is in the top quartile of all schools in the Commonwealth in terms of the kids' MCAS scores and, along with Wahconah, is one of the Districts' two Level 1 schools! Becket-Washington is also an Innovation School working with Columbia University's Teachers College for even greater achievement. Thanks to Principal Leslie Blake-Davis, her staff and the staff at CBRSD for bringing our kids and our community ever higher levels of excellence.

The installation of the new windows and doors at the Town Hall has started and we expect them all to be in before the Holidays. We will get an energy audit done after the installation is complete to see what our savings the new boiler, new lighting and tighter building envelope have brought us.

Thanks to Williams College we will be getting a fair amount of new furniture to replace our mismatched, damaged and worn file cabinets, tables, desks and chairs. We are also hoping to get a fire curtain for the stage.

Whether you love them or hate them, our venerable folding wooden chairs are going to be refurbished by "volunteers" at the Sheriffs Department and they will be back! And thanks to Ellen Bond for the nice new cushions for them!

The proposal for the Mapleview property is being considered by the Planning Board. If they approve of the plan we will hold a Special Town Meeting to vote on the issue.

We have applied for Federal Grant funding for a new bridge/culvert on Frost Road at Depot Brook.

The Town is also the primary signatory on a Community Innovation Challenge Grant to develop municipal accounting software. Thanks to Dan Parnell and Cathy Briggs for agreeing to work on this. The goal is to have a complete suite of state-supported software for all of our financial functions (tax assessors, tax collectors, accounting and treasury) that would be far less costly than what is available from private businesses.

We are working with Dalton and Hinsdale to restrict truck traffic along Kirchener/Blotz/Pittsfield Rd after the railway bridge on Route 8 in Hinsdale is complete.

The damage claim against CSX to pay for the flood damage caused to Upper Valley Road is still in progress.

We did not get the MassWorks grant to redo Washington Mountain Road but we will continue to pursue other ways of maintaining and upgrading the road.

We still have no indication whether Westfield Wild and Scenic will give us funding for new culverts on Cross Place Road.

There will be no Select Board meeting on Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve, and the next Select Board letter will be in the February *Tracks*. We wish everyone a joyous Holiday Season and a healthy, safe and prosperous 2013.


