

Harm Reduction Mobile Services

In order to conserve resources the mobile van will no longer be available at the Town Hall. There are scheduled van visits in Pittsfield and other Berkshire Towns. See the Town website or the website below for the current calendar.

The Harm Reduction Services van provides free naloxone and overdose education; syringe services and safe sharps disposal; testing and prevention for Hepatitis C, HIV, and STDs; as well as outreach for local recovery programs.

Our community is not immune to the unfortunate trends affecting Berkshire County regarding declining mental health and increased substance abuse, which have only worsened during the Covid pandemic.

This mobile program helps bring these vital health services directly to rural areas like ours where access and support can otherwise be out of reach.

The pre-holiday storm turned out not to be quite as disruptive as it could have been perhaps. And after a Christmas deep freeze, we're now looking at a warm wet mix to usher in the new year. Mother Nature has certainly been keeping us on our toes and reminding us who's in charge.

After a decade working for the Town, Adam Southard has now moved on from the Highway Dept. We thank him for his years of service and wish him well in his next venture. The crew will be running short-handed until we can find a replacement. Our thanks to Dave Fish for pitching in during recent storms. The Conservation Commission is also still looking for new members. Tricia Drugmand has stepped down, and we thank her for her service. Anyone who might be interested in stepping up please reach out to Michelle Lampro or the Select Board. Our Town relies on volunteers.

Last month, we <u>finally</u> managed to clear all hurdles and meet the State's criteria to achieve designation as a Green Community. The award was announced by the Governor on Dec. 20th, just before the holiday. Thanks to all the hard work of Dave Drugmand with Tina Hayward, Susan Colgan, and Peter Matson, this designation now paves the way for a \$126,500 grant to invest in facility upgrades at Town Hall and the Highway Garage, with the goal of reducing our municipal energy consumption by 20% or more (and thereby reducing our operating costs as well!).

Meanwhile, a December deadline in the Bucksteep tax-title case passed without any response from the owners. So the Town has now filed a motion with the Land Court for final judgment.

Unfortunately, despite all hopes, we begin the new year with the Shared Town Administrator position still unfilled. The Washington and Middlefield Select Boards will be continuing to interview candidates in the weeks ahead.

Although less in the news lately, Covid-19 remains an active concern this winter. Especially in conjunction with an active influenza (flu) season and an elevated RSV infection risk for children (the so-called "tripledemic"). The State is providing more free at-home Covid tests to communities. Tests are available at Town Hall during office hours. When we get the new shipment this month, our Board of Health will work to make test kits available at the Transfer Station as well.


