BROADBAND PROJECT UPDATE

Construction of the underground pathway along Lower Valley Road continues at a steady, if slow, pace. We are now just about three-quarters of the way through the project. Again, extra thanks are due to Dick Spencer for his invaluable help with

We are aiming to have Lower Valley Rd reopened before the end of July. The Highway crew is anxious to return to their regular duties around town. And we appreciate everyone's ongoing patience.

Final electrical connections for the central hub at Town Hall are still in process. Special thanks to Dave Drugmand for his help procuring and setting our backup generator.

The utilities continue with their make-ready. Eversource is nearing completion of its work. But Verizon may still be a couple months away from finishing up.

At this point, we are still anticipating that the fiber-optic construction might begin by September. If that schedule holds, then we may still be able to see service start to light up in town by the very end of this year. Fingers crossed!

The Parks Commission would like to recognize local businesses and residents for their support of our Town Park. The Parks Commission greatly appreciates his contribution of material and for donating the propane grill used to cook hotdogs during the pumpkin walk, hamburgers and hotdogs during the girls scout campout and during the annual cleanup held on Saturday June 8th. We are grateful to Mark Levernoch Plumbing and Heating who did a great job weatherizing the bathroom, protecting the plumbing over the winter and then re-opening the facilities again for spring. We are also grateful to LP Adams for donating the wood used to repair the gazebo and benches. Thank you to Mark Roos for repairing the benches and Dave Drugmand for replacing rotten gazebo step boards. The Commissions would like to also thank Selectmen Jim Huebner and Tricia Drugmand, residents Jodi Hostetter, Sara Cobb, Carlos Slutzki and future resident Chet Thomas for helping de-weed, rake and mulch. Thank you to Tom Johnson and Dave Waldon for helping Park Commission Chairman, Dave Drugmand install the foundation pipes for the new grills. Thank you to Amy Johnson for cleaning the gazebo floor and Ed Neumuth for helping the girls scouts make the bird boxes then installing them around the park. It is the contribution of these generous folks that keep the park the jewel of Washington hosting community events like the Hilltown Brouhaha, John FX Keator Memorial Pumpkin Walk, Cops and Rodders Car Show fundraiser, Girls Scout camp out, Dog Frisbee league, holiday tree lighting, residents and their pets. Unfortunately the volunteer turnout has continued to dwindle over the years making it more difficult to complete all the tasks necessary to maintain the safety and ascetics of the park. As a result the Parks Commission will request additional funds in the 2021 budget to allow hiring folks to perform some tasks. Thank you again to all who contributed. We hope to see you enjoying the park.

P. S. A special shout out to Chairman Dave Drugmand for the use of his tractor.

Thanks to all who contributed time and materials to the Park clean up on June 8, but we continue to have low participation. In order to maintain this important asset, the Board has to consider budgeting for a landscaping crew next spring.

We heard from a number of residents who were disturbed by two very loud explosions on Saturday June 1. Chief Miller investigated and the apparent cause was a resident using exploding targets for target practice. While target practice is lawful, detonating explosive is not. We ask that everyone be respectful of the impact of their actions on their neighbors. The Chief has also requested that she be notified any time someone plans to do target practice.

We are putting out a Request for Proposals to repair/replace the roof over the auditorium section of the Town Hall. We had a terrible leak last December which prompted the item on the Annual Town Meeting Warrant which was approved unanimously.

Construction continues on our broadband system. Our Highway crew is being augmented by volunteer labor from Kent Lew and Dick Spencer to place the underground cable along Lower Valley Road.

- The control structure for our system is in place next to the Town Hall; the electronics will be installed later.

A representative from the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs presented a plan that would allow for more use of OHV's (off Highway vehicles) in October Mountain State Forest. The Board responded that without additional financial support to maintain the roads from DOT and PILOT funding that it would not support the plan.

Highway:

- MEMA has requested more information on our request to fund the replacement of the deep culvert on upper Frost Road. On a positive note MEMA has approved our Hazard Mitigation Plan, clearing the way for grant approval.
- We have received a two-year extension on our Small Bridge Grant for the Middlefield Road bridge over Coles Brook. Foresight is investigating how we go forward on this seemingly endless project given that any expenditure over and above the \$500,000 grant will not be possible.
- Our engineer, Tighe & Bond, is still negotiating with DOT to determine how the three bridges on Lenox-Whitney Road can be repaired within the limits of the grant.

Property issues:

- We should know more about the future of Family Unity LLC on the Bucksteep property after court on June 26th.
- There is a signed purchase and sale agreement for Woody's; the prospective buyer wants to make it a music venue (for scheduled events only), a recording studio and plans to serve food. There is a long way to go, but we are encouraged.
- Nothing new on the properties owned by the Town in Virginia Lakes.
