On December 6, 2017 the town of Becket Board of Selectmen approved a new Beach Permit Policy. The Town of Washington section is printed below. New Beach Stickers can be purchased from the Town Clerk or Administrative Assistants Mondays between 7:00PM and 9:00PM.

Becket to Supply Beach Permits to the Town of Washington

### Town of Washington

- 1. The Town of Washington will be charged \$5 per permit (in addition to any other fee for beach maintenance or summer camp).
- 2. At the beginning of the beach season, the Town of Washington will sign out a set number of permits (100 or 200), and no later than September 15th, it must return to the Town of Becket the ones that it does not sell. By September 30th the Tax Collector will invoice (with a due date of November 1st) the Town of Washington for permits not returned.
- 3. The Town of Washington must maintain records of its residents who purchase the permits. The Town of Washington will maintain a database that includes the Town of Washington address, name of the property owner, and license plate number assigned to the permit. The vehicle registration should match the property owner. The Town of Washington shall provide an electronic spreadsheet to the Town of Becket Police Dept. for the Washington residents who received beach permits.
- 4. The Town of Washington is not permitted to distribute the permits to non-Washington residents.
- 5. The Town of Washington will continue to pay a separate beach maintenance fee (During FY2017 the Town of Washington paid \$2,500) to help defray costs of the summer camp.
- 6. Each house may have up to two beach permits. There is not room in the parking lot for unlimited cars per family.
- 7. Regardless of the number of owners assigned to a parcel, the town will issue up to two permits per home.

Over 100 of our citizens turned out to vote in our Annual Town Election.

- Dave Drugmand was newly elected to the Finance Committee.
- The question of making our Tax Collector an appointed position passed easily, so we will be reappointing Gina Campbell who has done a great job for us. Participation is the key to democracy!

We also had a great turnout for the Annual Town Meeting on May 9 – almost 50 voters! There were some lively discussions but all of the warrant items passed easily. Highlights:

- Washington will become a Green Community, joining 216 other Commonwealth municipalities and all of our neighboring communities. As a first benefit we expect a grant of roughly \$130,000 to go towards a repaired Town Hall roof covered with solar panels and a near-zero electric bill for all Town buildings in the future.
- The marijuana moratorium (article 2) means that the Town has until the end of 2018 to formalize policy; the Planning Board is working with Berkshire Regional Planning to develop recommendations.
- The Town can now move forward with selling all of the small lots in the old Berkshire Mountain Lakes development which have been donated or taken for taxes.
- Thanks to our Highway Superintendent, Tom Johnson, our highway budget actually decreased a bit over the last fiscal year!

Thanks to Senator Hinds, the latest Cherry Sheet shows the Senate version of the budget with full restoration of our PILOT funds. We hope this makes it through conference and the governor's signature. Senator Hinds is also pushing for reform of the PILOT process based on policy recommendations from Finance Chair Kent Lew.

Kent is also chairing a committee of the Historical Society and Parks Commission and our Maintenance Coordinator, Matt Thomas, to see how best to preserve the Town Common.

The owner of Woody's Road House has not responded to the demolition order jointly issued by our Building Inspector and Fire Chief. This most likely means protracted litigation

We have secured two separate grants for assistance in our Town Planning effort. Anyone interested in participating please contact Jodi.

We have appointed Becket Officer Nicole Miller to serve as our interim Police Chief and she is doing an excellent job. Longer term, Sean Connors is chairing a committee to determine the Town's need for policing. Please contact Sean if you have any thoughts or concerns.

We are still waiting for designs for the Middlefield Road bridge over Coles Brook and the deep culvert on upper Frost Road. We have grant funding for the designs and for the construction of the bridge but we are still seeking grant funding for the culvert.

We hope to see everyone on June 9<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM at the Town Park for our annual clean-up. We also hope you will be able to attend the presentation of our progress towards having high-speed internet on Saturday June 16 at 10:00 AM at the Town Hall.
