BROADBAND PROJECT UPDATE

Eversource and Verizon are actively working in town, preparing the utility poles for us to attach our fiber-optic cables. You may have seen their crews. It may take a few months still, but once the utilities complete their work, then our contractor will be able to begin installing the actual fiber.

The site for the main network hub has been prepared, next to Town Hall. The pre-fab concrete shelter is scheduled to be delivered on Tuesday, June 4. Many thanks to Dick Spencer, Dave Drugmand, and Frank Polizzi for all their volunteer assistance with this project.

Lower Valley Rd to Remain Closed a While Longer

The culverts along Lower Valley Rd have all been replaced now, but construction of the underground pathway for our fiber-optic network is moving much more slowly than we'd hoped. This is partly due to the Highway Dept being short-staffed this summer, since Adam has had to take medical leave. (We wish him all the best for his recovery.)

Unfortunately, this means that Lower Valley Rd will have to remain closed for several more weeks. We apologize for the ongoing inconvenience and appreciate the patience of the Johnson Hill, Middlefield, and Ryan Rd residents.

Thanks to everyone who took the time to vote on May 18. Congratulations to newly elected Finance Committee member Debra Megas, returning Select Board member Tricia Drugmand, returning Planning Board member Craig Willis, and returning Finance Committee Chair Kent Lew. The debt exclusion for the new Wahconah High School passed as well.

• This is the time of year when the Select Board makes appointments. Please let Jodi know it you would like to volunteer for the many jobs that need to be done!

Thanks also to those who came to vote at the Annual Town meeting on May 8. Nearly all warrant items were approved unanimously.

- One controversial item was funding for a gate to prevent partying at Ashley Lake. The Board was unanimous in support since we felt that in light of the terrible shooting there we needed to take a preventative measure.
- Our budget reflects a loss of over \$30,000 in funding but we will keep working with our legislative delegation to make the PILOT process transparent and equitable.

The construction of our broadband system has begun with new poles going up and underground cable being placed along Lower Valley Road.

• In order to better plan we need all residents to fill out a survey either on-line at www.wiredwest.net/towns/ washington or by picking up a hard copy at the Town Hall.

Highway:

- We have not yet heard if either of our grant requests (one to MEMA, one to DCR) to fund the replacement of the deep culvert on upper Frost Road has been granted.
- We received two bids for the Middlefield Road bridge over Coles Brook; one bid was for nearly \$700,000, the other almost \$1 million. Given our finances there was no way we could accept either bid. We are working with Foresight on what we can do next, but any expenditure over and above the \$500,000 Small Bridge grant is a non-starter.
- We are also negotiating with DOT over the \$500,000 Small Bridge grant for the three bridges on Lenox-Whitney Road; here too, we will reject any expenditure above the grant amount.

Property issues:

- The court date for our Health Agent's legal action against the owners of Bucksteep is set for the 26th of June.
- We have been told to expect a presentation from a potential buyer of Woody's Road House within the next few weeks.
- We are negotiating with the Nature Conservancy for their purchase of the properties owned by the Town in Virginia Lakes.

The Planning Board is working on several new by-laws including by-right commercial scale solar which will finally let us qualify for funding as a Green Community.

Thanks to Anne-Marie Desautels for her persistence in organizing a clean-up along our roads despite the weather.
