BROADBAND PROJECT UPDATE

Two steps forward, one step back... After making excellent progress in January and the first part of February, our construction has now unfortunately slowed to a crawl. We have 85% of the cable and about 70% of the MSTs installed; but Sertex has run out of work that they can productively tackle, due to ongoing residual make-ready issues that the utilities have not addressed in FSA02 and FSA03. The line crews have had to demobilize from town for the time being, until the way is clear again to proceed. As of press time, that return date has not yet been determined.

Nevertheless, we continue to work on getting the first Fiber Service Area spliced, tested, and certified. And we continue to work on getting final logistics for installations worked out. The goal is to be able to start scheduling installations in FSA01 within the next few weeks.

What are co-infections? Ticks carry a lot more than Lyme Disease. They can transmit many bacteria, viruses, protozoa and fungi, all in one bite and at the same time. Some of them are anaplasmosis, babesiosis, bartonella, borrelia miyamotoi, colorado tick fever, ehrlichiosis, mycoplasma, powassan viral encephalitis, Q fever, rocky mountain spotted fever, rickettsiosis, and tularemia as well as many others and many still being discovered. Co-infections are more common than previously thought, especially in those suffering from chronic lyme disease. A co-infected person may experience more severe illness, a larger amount of symptoms and a delayed recovery time.



The second "All-Hands" meeting was held on February 19. We had over 90% attendance from the boards, committees and individuals who keep our Town running.

- We were struck by the level of professionalism and dedication of the more than two dozen individuals who in turn represent many others who contribute their time and effort. We thank them all and remind everyone that there is always more to be done, so please volunteer any way you can.
- On a separate note Mike Case has volunteered to be the Town's representative to the Central Berkshire School Committee. This will be Mike's second turn in the position he has also chaired the School Committee and the Board highly recommended him to Superintendent Casna.

We have received nearly a hundred responses to our Town Planning questionnaire from you. We will use your insights and ideas along with financial and demographic information to create a profile of our Town. The profile will be available at http://www.washington-ma.com/ later this month. The profile along with a list of the challenges we face will also be presented at an open forum tentatively scheduled for April 18 from 1-3 at our Town Hall.

- We hope you can participate in the public forum and help us decide how best to meet our challenges to sustain our Town's character and solvency for the future.
- We would like everyone to be included so please continue sending surveys!

Berkshire Regional Planning has received a grant to study transportation needs in rural communities in coordination with the Age-Friendly Berkshires initiative. There will be a 15 minute presentation to the Select Board on Monday March 9 at 7 pm. Please plan to attend so your voice can be heard.

With marijuana production and sale now legal, the Town needs to address the complexities of law, environment and possible revenue. Washington is an attractive site for cultivation, but we want to make sure that our Town's character does not become distorted. In coordination with the Planning Board we are creating a Commission to sort out and propose policies to deal with potential growers and retailers. If you would like to participate, please let Jodi know.

The Broadband project remains on schedule for completion this spring. The next step is for individual homes to be hooked in.

• Remember that a credit for installation is only available to initial subscribers, so if you have not yet signed up for service, now is the time!

Highway:

• There has been no progress on any of the three projects that are pending: the Middlefield Road bridge, the bridges along the Lenox- Whitney Road and the replacement of the partially collapsed culvert on upper Frost Road. We hope to have workable plans for the first two and FEMA funding for the third before the warm weather.

Property issues:

- We hope to issue a Request for Quotes for the demolition of Woody's within the next week. If we get a low enough bid we will ask the voters to approve the work at the Annual Town Meeting.
- Once the weather warms we will be watching to see if the owners of Bucksteep are actually bringing the property into compliance with Board of Health regulations. Regardless, they are still liable for three years' back taxes.

Don't forget to vote in the primary on March 3. Democracy only works if we all participate!
