Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballots for the Annual Town Election are available. If you will not be able to vote in person at the Annual Town Election on Saturday, May 19, 2018, you can request an absentee ballot. The deadline to request an absentee ballot is Friday, May 18, 2018 at 12:00 PM. You have to request the absentee ballot

in writing by either completing the absentee ballot application: https://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/eleabsentee/absidx.htm or sending

a letter to the Town Clerk (postal or email letters are both accepted).

Please allow time for the Town Clerk to receive and process your application/letter and mail you a ballot. Allison Mikaniewicz, Town Clerk, washingtontownclerk@yahoo.com or 413-623-2185.

The Town Clerk will be out of town from May 13-18. If you request an absentee ballot during this time, please allow a few days for me to respond and get the ballot sent out.

FY19 Budget Summary

The total expenditures in the Town's upcoming FY19 budget come to \$1,652,613. This is a net increase in the town's budget of \$23,396 (1.44%) over FY18.

The largest driver in next year's budget increase is our CBRSD school assessment. We are among the four towns in the district that are seeing an increase in operating budget assessments. Washington's increase for FY19 is \$25,576. That is offset slightly by a decline of -\$8,852 in the capital assessment. With slight increases in costs for Vocational Ed., our total Education costs will see a net increase of \$21,311 for next year.

The FY19 budget includes a 2.0% cost-of-living-allowance increase to most wages, with the exception of the Select Board (who have again opted not to receive any increase) and a few minor positions. The net increase in wages is \$7,768, a portion of which is also due to the change to an appointed, professional Tax Collector.

Our Highway Dept. Supervisor has agreed to hold the Highway operating budget at level-funding for next year. The salary COLA increases will be offset by decreases in the Unemployment fund and Equipment Insurance. The result is a net decrease of -\$3,702 in the overall department budget, for the first time in many years.

The biggest financial news occurs on the other side of the equation, where we are facing a loss of non-tax revenue next year due to a decrease in our State Aid. Those who read the Berkshire Eagle may have seen the articles related to our loss of \$33,000 in PILOT reimbursement for state-owned land. Our legislators are seeking some measure of relief, but we cannot count on anything at this point. The loss of revenue may be offset to some extent by modest new growth in the tax base. But currently we are anticipating a total net increase in the Tax Levy of about \$40,500 or 3.37%.

The Finance Committee is currently projecting 1.25% growth in the Town's assessed value, based on preliminary information from the Assessors. If this holds true, along with current estimates for state aid and local revenue, then we project a tax rate of approximately \$15.14, an increase of \$0.31 (2.10%) over FY18. This would equate to an estimated increase in the Average Single Family Home annual tax bill of about \$70.

If you have any questions about the warrant items on the Annual Town Meeting (ATM) agenda, please come to the Town Hall Saturday May 5 between 10 and 12 am. And please come to the ATM next Wednesday May 9th at 7 pm. Democracy works best with full participation. Your vote counts!

- The Central Berkshire School Committee is no longer requesting an amendment to the District Charter so there are only four warrant questions remaining (Green Communities, a by-law to defer action on legalized marijuana, an exclusion from excise taxation for farmers, and authorization to sell Townowned lots in Virginia Lakes Estates).
- The Select Board has voted unanimously in favor of all warrant items.

The roof of long-time Washington landmark, Woody's Road House, collapsed on March 29. A demolition order has been jointly issued by our Building Inspector and Fire Chief.

Becket is asking that we collect \$5 for beach stickers this year. They will be available at the Town Hall.

Our complaint about losing over \$30,000 in PILOT funds has gotten attention: both Representative Pignatelli and Senator Hinds have pledged to work on legislative relief and to make DOR more accountable – and the 4/5/2018 editorial in the Berkshire Eagle helped!

Road and Bridge:

- Now that the snow is finally gone our road crew will be out grading all twenty-five miles of our gravel roads, sweeping our paved roads, replacing culverts and catching up on small projects like replacing the broken pillar on the Town Common and repairing some damaged driveways.
- We should soon have designs for the Middlefield Road bridge over Coles Brook and the deep culvert on upper Frost Road. Construction of the bridge will be funded by a \$500,000 Small Bridge grant; we are seeking grant funding for the culvert.

After several difficult years we were finally able to appoint Gina Campbell as our Tax Collector last year and she has done an excellent job. At last year's ATM there was a unanimous yes vote on Article 21 "To see if the Town will vote on the following question: Should the Tax Collector become an appointed Tax Collector of Town." By law this action needs to be confirmed at the year's annual Town election on May 19.

• The Board unanimously supports a "yes" vote on the question: Shall the Town vote to have its elected Tax Collector become an appointed Tax Collector of the Town?

We hope all of our citizens participate in the Annual Town Election on Saturday the 19th of May. The polls will be open from 12-4 at the Town Hall. Exercise your right to vote!
