### **BROADBAND PROJECT UPDATE**

Temporary Road Closing
Lower Valley Road
Approximately 4 weeks, starting May 6

For one or two days, Lower Valley Rd will be closed at the railroad crossing between Rte 8 and Cross Place Rd. Then, for the rest of the month, Lower Valley Rd will be closed from Cross Place Rd to the base of Johnson Hill Rd.

This temporary closure is to allow construction of an underground pathway for our fiber-optic network to connect the Johnson Hill, Middlefield Rd, and Ryan Rd neighborhoods with our main distribution back to the central hub at Town Hall.

At the same time, the Highway Dept will also be replacing all of the culverts along that route.

We apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate your patience with these projects.

Thanks to all who voted to build a new Wahconah High School. The turnout was great and the Town's sentiment to have a new school that we can all be proud of was overwhelming.

• The funding of the new school will begin with in FY2021; there will be a debt exclusion question on the 5/18 Town election ballot that we hope receives the same level of support.

We also had a great turnout of over 40 residents at the Broadband update on April 13.

- The service is projected to be competitive with private sector offerings especially for telephone.
- Construction will begin this month with underground fiber conduit along Lower Valley Road unfortunately this will mean that the road will be temporarily closed.
- Kent Lew and Steve Nelson have donated enormous amounts of time and energy to the project and we can't thank them enough!

The Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee completed our mitigation plan and submitted it to MEMA along with a new grant application to replace the deep culvert on upper Frost Road

• Thanks to everyone who filled out the Natural Hazard questionnaire.

We have put the new bridge on Middlefield Road over Coles Brook out for bid; the bid opening will be on May 6 so we hope to complete the project this year, fully five years after DOT reduced the weight limit.

Our Health Agent, Charlie Kaniecki, in coordination with Town Counsel, is starting legal action against the owners of Bucksteep. Over a year ago Charlie issued an enforcement order which has been completely ignored. By statute we can impose a fine of up to \$1000 a day for noncompliance.

We have written once again to our elected officials to reform the PILOT process and restore the over \$30,000 that the Baker administration plans to cut from our FY2020 reimbursement. We have also requested the authority to impose some level of taxation on properties currently considered to be tax-exempt.

Another owner of one of the small plots in Virginia Lakes has offered to donate it to the Town; a warrant item to accept the property will be on the Annual Town Meeting warrant.

• Although unwinding of this unconforming subdivision is a knotty legal and financial problem our goal remains getting as much financial benefit as possible for the Town.

For two weekends in a row the clean-up along our roads was thwarted - except for a few hardy individuals who braved the sleet last Saturday - by bad weather. We will try again:

• Please come to the Town Hall at 9 am Saturday May 11 to get organized. Safety vests and collection bags will be available and our highway crew will do pick-ups.

- We hope to see everyone at the Town Hall on Wednesday May 8 for the Annual Town Meeting at 7 pm.
- Make sure to vote in the Annual Town Election Saturday May 18 from 12-4 pm.
