### **BROADBAND IS COMING... BELIEVE IT!**

Thanks to everyone who attended the Sign-up Kickoff Event on Oct 12. We had a great turnout, with lots of good questions. We are already halfway to our sign-up goal!

This is *our* town network. The long-term viability of it depends upon as many of us as possible participating. The more subscribers we have, the greater the likelihood that we can keep the monthly service costs low, and the greater our potential for Co-op dividends to return to the Town.

### Now Is the Time to Sign Up!

Sign up before Dec 31 to receive a \$650 drop credit toward your installation costs. Go to **www.wiredwest.net/washington** to get started.

### (Even if you gave a deposit and/or filled out a survey, you still need to do this one last step!)

The Governor has recently allocated additional funds for towns building their own networks. This means that we should now be able to pay for the \$650 drop credit for startup subscribers without raiding our town savings (i.e. Stabilization Fund). But the amount that we're eligible for is directly tied to the number of startup subscribers.

### **PROJECT UPDATE**

We've gotten off to a bit of a rocky start, due to some make-ready not being done by the utilities, even though we received all our pole licenses. We hope to have this issue resolved soon, and Sertex should be able to hit their stride in the next few weeks.

We are currently projecting that the first homes will get connected starting in January. Installations will be able to begin as each Fiber Service Area is finished, tested, and certified. The whole process is expected to extend into the spring.

### Call for Donations

The Parks Commission is holding a children gift shopping room during the December 7, 2019 bazaar at the Town Hall, 9am-4pm.

We are looking for new items, slightly used items or cash donations to purchase item that children can buy for their loved ones for only \$1.00. We could also use wrapping paper, tags, bows or gift bags. Please drop off your donation at the Town Hall.

Thanks to everyone who turned out for the Special Town Meeting on September 23. Outside of two financial "housekeeping" items, the main issue was allocating \$75,000 from the stabilization fund to make sure that every household that wishes to be connected to our broadband network would have a \$650 credit towards the road-to-home connection.

- We will not need the money from stabilization if one of three other funding sources comes through: additional construction money from the state or the federal government or a Small Town Capital grant.
- Construction of the Broadband network remains on schedule with the first actual home hookups the calendar year.

Although we received no responses to our RFP for a consultant to create an ADA transition plan for full Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance, resident Terry Robbins has stepped forward to head up the effort. Based on Terry's years of experience in support of housing for the disabled we were able to apply for a planning grant from the MA Office on Disability. The awards will be announced in December.

The Board has selected a candidate to replace Treasurer Glen Grogan but not yet formalized the appointment; we are still looking for a replacement for our Town Accountant, Dan Parnell.

The Commonwealth mandates that we have a Procurement Officer "...responsible for all activities related to buying, leasing, renting or otherwise acquiring supplies or services..." Berkshire Regional Planning is now offering to provide this; the Board is considering the contract.

The Broadband presentation on October 12 was well-attended and well received; many of our citizens have already signed up for service, please join us!

Our BRPC resource for Town Planning, Matt Dovell, is now fully on board and we will be re-starting this initiative. There will be ample opportunity for input from our residents. We expect to have a plan by summer.

### Highway:

- Foresight is proposing some cost savings for the replacement of the Middlefield Road bridge, but any construction this year is doubtful
- MEMA has recommended our grant application to fund the replacement of the deep culvert on upper Frost Road to FEMA. If approved the Town will need to provide 25% of the construction costs.
- Between Gill Engineering and DCR the three bridges on Lenox-Whitney Road may be repaired within the \$500,000 of the Small Bridge grant. Turns out that DCR needs access to implement tree cutting in October Mountain State Forest and so may pay for some of the needed repair; Gill has some creative ideas for the rest.

### Property issues:

- The Board of Health met to act on our Health Agent's recommendation that all of Bucksteep's buildings be condemned for not having working septic systems. There will also be a Housing Court hearing on November 20.
- Once we have the hazardous materials inspection report we will be issuing an RFP for the demolition of Woody's. There will need to be a Special Town meeting to approve the expenditure.
- We are waiting for a recommendation from the Board of Health, our Health Agent and the Planning Board regarding the proposed "glamping" operation.

The Pumpkin Walk was extremely well-attended. We hope everyone had a chance to go


We meet at 1:30pm on the first Tuesday of the month to discuss the book over tea/coffee and make our next selection.
