Hello fellow Washingtonians! Here is some information for those doing fall gardening, and planning for spring planting.

As I was gardening last week, I came across an unusual worm. The worms acted differently, more slithering than crawling, and were very active. So, I began to research these creatures, and found they are **Asian Jumping Worms**. They are also called "crazy worms", or "snake worms." Normally earthworms are beneficial to soil and plant health, however, **these invasive species are destructive** and have several survival tactics. They first appeared in Wisconsin in 2013, and still there is uncertainty as to how they can be eradicated.

A few facts: The worms feed on plant roots, and beneficial fungi, disturbing the healthy soil. Soil affected by jumping worms has decreased moisture, becomes compacted, erosion increases, which increases the risk of disease. The soil can no longer properly support plants. It becomes a poor environment for native plants to grow and invasive plant species eventually establish themselves. In a jumping worm-invaded habitat canopy cover may be thinned out as well as ground cover. The lack of vegetation exposes ground dwelling critters to potential predators resulting in reduced biodiversity of animals. With awareness, knowledge of their life cycle, and management, we can ensure a healthier ecosystem. (From Formecology)

- Proof of spay or neuter, if applicable
- Fee: \$4.00 if spayed/neutered or \$10 if not

You can also mail the above (checks payable to Town of Washington) to the Town Clerk, 8 Summit Hill Rd, Washington, MA 01223 and a license and tag will be mailed back to you.

Please note that if you received a 2021 late fee invoice, you will have to pay that first before receiving your 2022 license/tag.

November 2021

Mornings are turning frosty. It's time to put the gardens to bed, store away the mower, bring in the firewood, get the storm windows up, and prepare for the season ahead.

We welcome Jim Atwell of Becket to the Highway crew. He brings experience in vehicle maintenance, equipment operation, and grounds keeping from decades of work with regional YMCAs. Tom, Adam and Jim will be busy replacing culverts, fixing beaver deceivers, patching potholes, and repairing roadside washouts before it's time to mount the snow plows.

The final demise of the Woody's Roadhouse structure marks the end of a years-long struggle to get that public danger (and eyesore) addressed. Thanks to new property owner Jacob Trudeau for doing the right thing and taking responsibility so the taxpayers didn't have to foot the bill.

Speaking of taxpayers, property tax bills have just gone out. Not always a welcome occasion, we know. But this is the primary way we pay to educate our children, plow our roads, and dispose of our trash. Because of revaluations, our tax rate has gone down to \$14.84 (-\$1.85 from last year), although many homeowners may see a higher overall bill due to an increase in property value.

• First installments are due by Nov 23, 2021. Be sure to pay the entire first half by then to avoid incurring interest. Remember, we have an online payment option now; a link is on the town website. There's also a secure dropbox outside Town Hall, for those who don't trust the mail.

There will be a **Special Town Meeting on Monday, 11/15, at 7:00 p.m.** to consider amendments to our Solar Photovoltaic Bylaw that will enable us to seek Green Communities status and access to grant funding, along with a few housekeeping articles. And we will be holding a **Special Election on Saturday, 12/4, 12:00 – 4:00 p.m.** to fill the vacant Select Board seat and elect a Municipal Light Board to oversee our broadband enterprise.

Thanks to Carol Lew, David Weissbrod, Linda Levernoch, Jane Pytko, Susan Matson, Ellen Bond, Scott Hayward, Josh Greene, John McElwain, and David Ellis for helping clean and re-set many headstones in the Old Town Hall Cemetery this past month. There will be more to attend to in the spring, so stay tuned for future opportunities to join in and get involved.

This year's Flu Clinic at Town Hall provided flu vaccinations for 31 residents. Thanks to our Public Health Nurse Leslie Drager and her helpers.

With Covid-19 infection rates remaining high in Berkshire County, be sure to get a booster shot if and when you are eligible. You can find Covid vaccination availability at *vaxfinder.mass.gov* (either boosters or first-time shots!). Stay safe and stay warm, everyone.
