(Thanks also to Victor Breen for having served in this position up until now - Victor wears many different hats for the Town!) Glenn Grogan has been sworn in as Town Auditor. Glenn will be working together with our Treasurer and Town Accountant to make sure that our finances are transparent, accurate and in compliance with all DOR requirements.

Washington's spirit of volunteerism was on display on September 15<sup>th</sup> at the Hilltown Hoot. Thanks to all of those who made this event possible by parking cars, providing security and facilities, and, of course, making great music. A good time was had by all and our schools got thousands of dollars in donations.

Another of Washington's signature events, The Annual Sons & Daughters reunion on September 9<sup>th</sup>, featured music, abundant and delicious food and the chance to celebrate our Town together. Thanks to all who made it possible and all who participated. We hope to see everyone there next year.

And don't forget that the third of Washington's unique Fall celebrations: The John F. X. Keator Memorial Pumpkin Walk is coming up on Friday October 26.

The tax rate is actually going down a bit to \$12.91 per thousand for the new year; moreover, thanks to the hard work of our Assessors, we were the 7<sup>th</sup> municipality in the Commonwealth to have our rate certified.

The Mass Infrastructure Grant to resurface Washington Mountain Road has been submitted.

Seeing that more than half of the municipalities in the Commonwealth each received a minimum of \$125,000 for being Green Communities, the Board is considering bringing this up for another vote at Town Meeting. The funds can be used to defray the cost of energy efficiency projects for our homeowners!

We delayed the bid opening to replace the windows and doors at the Town Hall until October 1 since we have to make provisions for removing the lead paint on the exterior of the Town Hall before any work can be done.

Thanks to all those who attended the Special Town Meeting on 9/10 to approve borrowing authority for the doors and windows; we expect that at least some of the funding can be taken from the Town's Free Cash once our FY12 books are closed.

We are looking for grant funding to pay for the lead paint removal and repainting.

We are working on:

The claim with CSX to pay for the damage caused to Upper Valley Road;

The Mapleview demolition;

Placing a weight restriction on Blotz Road

The FEMA/MEMA grant application to restructure/rebuild the Depot Brook culvert/bridge/dam area; and

Support from Westfield Wild and Scenic for new culverts on Cross Place Road.

#### AUNT MAGGIES SPICY ZUCHINI BROWNIES

The Brownies:

- 1 1/2 Cups Flour
  - 1/2 Cup Cocoa Powder, unsweetened
- 1 Cup Sugar
- 1 Tsp Baking Soda
- 2 Tsps Cinnamon
- 3/4 Tsp Cayenne Pepper
- 2 Eggs, 1 Cup Oil
- 2 Tsps Almond Extract
- 3 1/2 Cups Shredded Zucchini

Grease a 9 X 9" square baking pan. Set aside. Preheat Oven t 350 degrees.

In a Large Mixing Bowl, combine dry ingredients. Slowly mix in Oil, Eggs, and Almond Extract. Once thoroughly mixed, add zucchini, 1/2 cup at a time. Mix well. Pour into prepared pan.

Bake for 25-30 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool in Pan. Once brownies have cooled, add the cream cheese frosting by swirling it onto the brownies.

## CREAM CHEESE FROSTONG

4 Oz. softened Cream Cheese
1/2 Cup Softened Butter
2 Cups Powdered Sugar
1 TBs Almond Extract
Combine all Ingredients until smooth.
