The turnout at the annual Sons & Daughters reunion was tremendous! We hope everyone enjoyed learning about our history – not to mention the great music and food! Thanks to all who helped make it a success. Thanks also to the vendors and musicians and organizers of the Hilltown Hoot!

Our long-serving Assessor, Cheri Rodhouse, has resigned. The annual salary for an Assessor is \$3150 and the Town will pay to train any resident who might be interested in the position. Let Jodi Hostetter know!

The Becket Arts Council wants to appoint a Washington resident to its Board which meets every third Monday. Anyone interested please let Jodi know.

The Select Board has appointed Glenn Grogan, a Washington resident, as our new Treasurer. Glenn has tremendous financial experience and has served as our Auditor this past year – a post we will now have to fill. If anyone is interested, let Jodi know.

14 people got free flu shots at the Flu Clinic on September 21 at the Town Hall. This is just one of the benefits that our residents get from our participation in the Berkshire Public Health Alliance. The Board is also exploring other types of shared services.

Now that the rehabilitation of Washington Mountain Road is underway – DOT is currently doing survey work in support of putting the project out to bid late this year – we can turn our attention to other needed improvements to our infrastructure:

- The grant funding for flood control of Depot Brook and widening Frost Road has been resubmitted to FEMA. Even with funding the Town will have to pay some of the cost.
- We are working with Westfield Wild & Scenic for funding to design a permanent bridge on Cross Place Road.
- It appears unlikely that we will get support from Dalton and Hinsdale to further restrict vehicle weight on Blotz Road
- We have applied for a MassWorks grant to repave Blotz Road.

The Town Hall Use Committee is once again soliciting help from the Sheriff's Department for painting inside the Town Hall. They are also planning new cabinets for the kitchen and other improvements. A new office for our Fire Chief and Emergency Manager, Paul Mikaniewicz, will be created within the Town Clerk's office space.

Thanks to our Highway Crew for doing such a fantastic job getting the bridge on lower Cross Place Road replaced in less than two weeks. We were fortunate that a Bailey bridge owned by MA DCR was available, but it took a concerted effort by our guys plus engineering help from Phil Clark to make it happen so quickly. We are still considering our next steps, but the temporary bridge is fully functional and will serve for as long as we need it.

Don't forget that the annual John F. X. Keator Pumpkin Walk is coming up this month. There will be an organizational meeting on Wednesday October 2 at 6:30 at the Town Hall for anyone who wants to help make this another one of Washington's truly special events.
