
Sarah Lee Guthrie and Johnny Irion have a new album out!

The WASHINGTON CULTURAL COUNCIL SEEKS FUNDING PROPOSALS

Proposals for community-oriented arts, humanities, and science programs are accepted from September 1, 2013 to/and no later than October 15, 2013. Any application received after Oct 16, 2013 is not accepted.

The Washington Cultural Council has set an October 15th postmark deadline for organizations, schools and individuals to apply for grants that support cultural activities in the community. This deadline is mandated by the Massachusetts Cultural Council.

These grants can support a variety of artistic projects and activities: including exhibits, festivals, field trips, short-term artist residencies or performances in schools, workshops and lectures.

The Washington Cultural Council is part of a network of 329 Local Cultural Councils serving all 351 cities and towns in the Commonwealth. The LCC Program is the largest grassroots cultural funding network in the nation, supporting thousands of community-based projects in the arts, sciences and humanities every year. The state legislature provides an annual appropriation to the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency, which then allocates funds to each community.

Our apologies for missing the deadline for the August *Tracks*!

Jeff Sawtelle has taken over the Council on Aging. Jeff brings great experience and energy and we expect he will build on the good work Rose Borgnis has done in the past two years. We thank Rose for her service and also want to thank Frank Kennedy who is retiring from his years of service as our webmaster, a role we have hired John Les to fill. We note with regret that our Treasurer, Cathy Briggs, is resigning due to an increased work load at her day job. She did a great job for us and will be missed. Applications are open if you know anyone interested.

Thanks to all who turned out for the 6/24 and 7/22 Special Town Meetings. We will be purchasing a new 4-wheel drive Expedition School Bus to replace the old Suburban which can no longer safely transport our Voc-Ed students. As in the past, we will also transport Becket students, greatly reducing the cost to the Town.

Our grant request for funding to restructure the Eden Glen area prone to flooding and washing the road out was turned down by FEMA, but we were actually the next in line. We have re-submitted for the next round of grant funding and are pursuing other funding sources.

The Town Hall use committee has decided to continue the use of our venerable wooden folding chairs and forego the expense of replacing them. Some changes in progress: displaying some of the Town's artwork and historical photographs, some additional improvements to the kitchen and bathrooms, and completion of the painting on the interior of the auditorium. We thank Williams College for all of the furniture provided to us but going forward we will specify what's best for the Town instead of relying on donations.

While nothing is ever certain before it actually happens, the Select Board's appeal to our legislators and the Secretary of Transportation for emergency funding for Washington Mountain Road has borne fruit. An Act Relative to Transportation Finance has passed and will provide funding for the full reclamation of Washington Mountain Road if the accompanying bond bill is also passed. DOT has prioritized the project and will begin design work during the last week of August. The plan is to put the project out for bid by the end of 2013 for construction in the spring. By all means contact our state representatives and thank them!

The bridge on lower Cross Place Road has deteriorated and needs to be replaced. The bridge has been restricted to one-way traffic and a second steel plate has been placed on the span by our Highway crew. A temporary bridge will be erected quickly if we are able to utilize an available structure owned by MA DCR. Otherwise we will need to design and construct a temporary bridge which will take up to six weeks. The design and construction of a replacement bridge may take several years, but the temporary bridge will be fully functional during that time.

We hope to see everyone at:

- The Sons & Daughters Reunion starts at noon on September 8 at the Old Town Hall. There will be food and festivities for all to celebrate our history!
- The free Flu Clinic on Saturday September 21 from 4 to 6 pm at the Town Hall.
- The Hilltown Hoot (noon to 7 pm on September 14) will offer the best music of the Berkshires plus food and fun for a great cause all proceeds go to our schools!
