BROADBAND PROJECT UPDATE

We have received our pole licenses from Eversource and are now waiting for Verizon. They're supposed to be done with make-ready in town by the third week in September. So, we have a kickoff meeting scheduled with Sertex, our fiber-optic construction contractor, for Sept 24, with a tentative date for construction starting on Oct 1st.

Getting Closer . . .

We are now working on having our system in place to start officially signing up customers in early October. The date for a sign-up kickoff meeting will be announced in next month's Tracks.

But before we can do that, we need to finalize how much discount the Town will be able to offer on the installation costs. The current projections do not leave enough funding after construction to cover our desired target amount. There are two possibilities for additional state funding that are pending. But the results of these requests will not be known in time to continue on our present schedule. So, at the Special Town Meeting on Sept 23 we will be asking the voters to approve an additional appropriation as a fallback in order to keep moving ahead with the current plans. Please come join that discussion.



Dan Parnell, our Town Accountant, and Glen Grogan, our Treasurer, plan to retire at the end of 2019. We thank them for their years of service to the Town. These part time positions require knowledge of municipal finance and at least one evening - Monday - a week at the Town Hall. If you are interested or know someone who might be interested please let Jodi know.

The Board has adopted a policy of compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) which appears separately in this month's *Tracks*. We have put out an RFP for a consultant to help us with a transition plan for full ADA compliance which will be funded by a Mass Office on Disability planning grant. We once again invite any and all interested residents who want to participate in this process to contact Jodi.

We were unable to position the Town to apply for Green Community this year. What is needed is a zoning by-law to set aside a small area of Town for a large-scale solar array. The Board is considering the area behind the railroad tracks above the Town Park. We expect to have the new zoning law ready for approval at the Annual Town Meeting next May.

There will be a Special Town Meeting on Monday September 23 at the Town Hall. One article will be to allow our Highway Crew to participate in a new family leave program set up by the Commonwealth and funded by payroll deductions. Another will be to set aside additional funding to assure completion of our broadband network.

• Broadband construction remains on schedule and we are hoping that the \$100,000 Housing Choice Small Town Capital Grant will be awarded which would eliminate the need for additional Town funds.

Highway:

- We have no word yet on either of our two grant applications to fund the replacement of the deep culvert on upper Frost
- The \$500,000 small bridge grant to repair the three bridges on Lenox-Whitney Road remains in limbo. We have no design and no indication of help from DOT.
- DOT has responded to us regarding the bridge on Middlefield Road over Coles Brook; they, and our engineer, Foresight are reviewing options and the two bids we received to fit any solution within the \$500,000 Small Bridge grant.

Property issues:

- The inspection of Bucksteep revealed that all six of its septic systems are inadequate. Our health agent is preparing a report for the next court appearance on September 18. We have no indications of Family Unity's plans since the property cannot be used without proper sanitation.
- The prospective buyer for Woody's has again reached out to the Board but has not done anything that would forestall the demolition contract we expect to sign next month.
- A property owner has proposed using four lots along Lower Valley for "glamping". This will require both a special permit from the Planning Board and a Board of Health sign-off. There will likely be a public hearing next month.
- Dick Spencer has taken on the challenge of negotiating with Nature Conservancy for the sale of Town-owned property in Virginia Lakes.
