We hope everyone has had a chance to drive by the Washington Town Park and see the beautiful new sign posts installed for the park. Pandemic update: The Commonwealth has imposed a two-week quarantine on anyone entering or returning to Massachusetts *unless* from Maine, New Jersey, Hawaii or any of our neighboring states except Rhode Island.

• A newly created map of the Commonwealth divides municipalities into four categories: red for those with more than 8 cases per 100,000 in the past two weeks (four towns north of Boston), yellow for those with 4-8 cases, green for those with under 4 and white for those with essentially no reported cases. All Berkshire County shows white, except Pittsfield (green). We are getting ahead of the pandemic but please keep doing what you are doing!

Washington's response to the 2020 Census has been lower than our 2010 response rate. Our representation at and funding from both the state and federal government depend on an accurate and complete count of our residents. If you have not yet done so, please send in your census report. This is a civic responsibility almost as important as voting.

The lower portion of the Town Hall roof has been repaired and gutters installed. The leaks that have plagued us for years should be gone and the new insulation should lower our heating costs.

We have applied for an implementation grant to address the ADA access deficiencies identified in the ADA Self-Evaluation put together by Terry Robbins (available on the Town website).

The Town's fiber optic network is all but complete, with just a few dozen customers left to get connected." Thanks, Kent!!

Highway:

- We have had no word on any of our grant proposals (Frost Road culvert, Lenox-Whitney Road bridges and Middlefield Road bridge).
- Upper Valley Road has been raised and paved.
- Culverts have been installed on Lovers' Lane, Blotz and Summit Hill roads.

As a Green Community the Town would receive over \$100,000 for energy-saving projects. A committee headed up by Dave Drugmand is putting together the application. There will need to be a Special Town Meeting for voters to approve a zoning change for a large-scale solar array. Details to follow.

The Town Planning Committee has adopted this Mission Statement: *Chart a course with a Town plan which articulates a long-term vision based on the priorities of the community that will ensure viability and sustain it for our future.* The results of the interviews and surveys conducted earlier this year have been posted on the website. Next steps: a follow-up survey, a preliminary plan and a public review.

Stay safe, enjoy your garden and the warm weather while it lasts. And keep in mind that a level 2 drought has been declared for the Commonwealth.
