WASHINGTON CULTURAL COUNCIL SEEKS FUNDING PROPOSALS Proposals for community-oriented arts, humanities, and science programs due October 15th

The **Washington Cultural Council** has set an **October 15th** deadline for organizations, schools and individuals to apply for grants that support cultural activities in the community.

These grants can support a variety of artistic projects and activities in **Washington** including exhibits, festivals, field trips, short-term artist residencies or performances in schools, workshops and lectures.

The **Washington Cultural Council** is part of a network of 329 Local Cultural Councils serving all 351 cities and towns in the Commonwealth. The LCC Program is the largest grassroots cultural funding network in the nation, supporting thousands of community-based projects in the arts, sciences and humanities every year.

The state legislature provides an annual appropriation to the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency, which then allocates funds to each community.

This year, the **Washington Cultural Council** will distribute about **\$4,800** in grants.

The on-line application period opens September 1, 2021.

Applications are available on line at http://www.mass-culture.org

All applications must be submitted on line by the October 15th deadline. The Massachusetts Cultural Council will no longer allow paper applications.

Town of Washington Citizen's Committee to Combat Litter and Dumping

"Obie, I don't think I can pick up the garbage with these handcuffs on," Arlo Guthrie told the Stockbridge Police Chief after being nabbed for dumping garbage. More than 50 years later, littering in his hometown of Washington will now be as aggressively policed.

Several of Washington's 538 residents have joined forces to establish a new citizen's committee, coordinating with the town government on enforcement strategies. Much of the town's 38.8 square miles are devoted to open space, including October Mountain State Forest, the Appalachian Trail and the Pittsfield Watershed. The goal of the committee is to help preserve the beauty of that undeveloped land and the safety of the water supply through strategies that discourage and diminish littering and dumping in town.

The members of the committee include Ed Neumuth, a retired veterinarian who runs birding programs for Canyon Ranch; Matt Watson, a lawyer in town who has developed a network of trail cameras to record wildlife in the woods surrounding his home, and Joshua Greene, a magazine editor and frequent hiker.

The committee will propose strategies to the Select Board, including road signage, litter patrols and surveillance cameras at sites where dumping has occurred in the past. Watson will contribute a number of trail cameras to the project, in a pilot program to determine their effectiveness at deterring or catching perpetrators.

Nicole Miller, Washington Police Chief, is advising the committee on best practices for enforcement and evidence gathering.

The committee hopes to enlist members of the Washington community as well as visitors who travel to town to hike, ski or ride their ATVs. Residents of Pittsfield, in particular, who rely on water from three pristine lakes in town—Ashley, Farnham and Sandwash—will benefit from added security that may help diminish any toxins leaching into the reservoirs.

Jason Murphy, Water Superintendent in Pittsfield, sends his teams to check on the reservoirs in Washington. He and his wife carry a bag with them when they ride ATVs in the State Forest, picking up cans and bottles that others may have tossed. "It's beautiful up there on the mountain and if you want to go hang out, I have no problem with that," he says. "But follow the posted rules and carry your trash out with you."

Behind the old Town Hall on Washington Mountain Road, there's a graveyard where many of our town's founding fathers and mothers are buried. Beautiful old gravestones have been falling in disrepair for quite some time, and we're planning to do something about it.

There's an excellent, product called D2 Biological Solutions. It kills, mold, mildew, algae, and lichen growth that disintegrate stone carvings and obscure the lettering. On September 25th from 10 am to 3pm, (rain date Sunday September 26th) there will be a volunteer work party where we'll spray earmarked stones with this solution. The second part of the gravestone restoration project is about saving old headstones from new damage. Many are leaning. Before winter, we'll be adding supports to 20 stones that are most at risk of falling. In the spring, we'll be righting them. With the CDC's declaration of Berkshire County as a Covid-19 high-transmissibility county, the Select Board made the decision to require masks for everyone while inside Town Hall, regardless of vaccination status, until further notice. If you have not gotten vaccinated, please consider doing so, especially now that the Pfizer vaccine has received full FDA approval.

Heavy storms and Hurricane Henri caused more periodic flooding last month. The repeated flooding on Rte 8 has been disruptive. Efforts have been made to protect the Town Park, while we explore longer-term solutions. We are still grappling with how to pay for restoration of the immense erosion at Eden Glen that threatens the Frost Rd embankment. Talks with MEMA and FEMA are ongoing. The Hwy Dept remains short-staffed as we seek a new truck driver/equipment operator to join the crew. The WiredWest Co-op completed its first full year of operations, with the broadband networks of Rowe, Washington, New Salem, and Windsor all fully lit up. Heath and Becket are still coming on line. The operation was able to realize excess annual revenue and each Town's share of FY21 dividends has been distributed. Washington received \$30K for its portion.

However, we face a conundrum since our Broadband Manager now also chairs the Select Board that approves his policy recommendations. To resolve this conflict of interest, the Board proposes to establish a separate, elected Municipal Light Board to oversee these responsibilities. There will be **Special Town Meeting on Monday, September 27, at 6:00** to take up this question, as well as a few other housekeeping items. We have also called for a **Special Town Election on December 4** to fill the vacant Select Board seat.

The old Woody's property has a new owner. The owner has applied for a demolition permit, but at the time of this writing, a timeline has not yet been established. The Select Board will continue to press for a resolution and keep options open for Town action, if necessary.

The Town Plan Steering Committee held its first meeting with a group of civic-minded volunteers who want to help strengthen our community and shape its future. If you too would like to play a part, please contact Jodi Hostetter at washington.aas@gmail.com.
