Article 1: To see if the Town will to accept the provisions of General Laws Chapter 258, Section 13, which provides that the town shall indemnify and save harmless municipal officers, elected or appointed, from personal financial loss and expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, in an amount not to exceed one million dollars, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of any act or omission except an intentional violation of civil rights of any person under any law, if the official at the time of such act of omission was acting within the scope of his official duties or employment.

Article 2: To see if the Town will accept the provisions of General Laws Chapter 39, Section 23D, which provides that a member of any municipal board, committee or commission when holding an adjudicatory hearing shall not be disqualified from voting in the matter solely due to that member's absence from no more than a single session of the hearing at which testimony or other evidence is received, provided that before any such vote, the member shall certify in writing that he/she has examined all evidence received at the missed session, which evidence shall include an audio or video recording of the missed session or a transcript thereof, with such certification to be part of the record of the hearing.

Article 3: To see if the Selectmen shall be an agent for the Town in defense of any suits for, and on behalf of the Town, and to adjust all claims for damage against the Town, and to choose an agent, or pass any vote thereon.

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of revenue for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, and to issue a note or notes therefore payable within one year, in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44 of the General Laws, also temporary loans under Provision 6A, Chapter 44 of the General Laws.

Article 25: To see if the Town will amend its Departmental Revolving Funds bylaw to add the following authorized revolving fund to Table 11.1 for the collection and payment of certain tax title fees:

- b. Officer Authorized to Spend from Fund: Tax Collector or Treasurer
- c. Fees, Charges or Receipts Credited to Fund: Fees, charges and costs collected for tax-title proceedings under M.G.L. Ch 60 §§15, 55, 62, 65, 68, or 79
- d. Expenses Payable from Fund: Fees, charges and costs incurred for tax-title proceedings under M.G.L. Ch 60 §§15, 55, 62, 65, 68, or 79

- h. Tax-Title Fees & Charges: Expenditures not to exceed \$7,000

i. Becket Beach Fund: Expenditures not to exceed \$3,500
